



ANNOUNCING THE **SUSAN D. FLYNN MEMORIAL** ONCOLOGY NURSING EXTERNSHIP

We are pleased to announce a new opportunity for our junior BSN students. The *Susan D. Flynn Memorial Oncology Nursing Externship*, funded by Fred Flynn in memory of his late wife, was inspired by the expert nursing care Mrs. Flynn received at the end of her life. ***The purpose of this externship is to inspire and educate the next generation of oncology nurses.***

Emory's 8-week immersion program, built on the partnership between the School of Nursing and Emory Healthcare, focuses primarily on Winship Cancer Institute (WCI). The externship occurs in eight weeks during June and July, during which time students receive a stipend in the amount of \$4000 to work full time alongside specially selected preceptors across a variety of inpatient and outpatient settings, including – but not necessarily limited to – the following:

- Inpatient units such as bone marrow transplant, leukemia and lymphoma, and medical, surgical, and radiation oncology.
- Outpatient infusion centers
- WCI's Phase I Clinical Trials unit.
- Emory's Center for Palliative Care.

Other experiences may be included depending on the students' interests and opportunities that arise during the externship period.

Externs will also engage in a clinical inquiry project guided by a research mentor. Depending on the scope of that project, it may be continued during the senior year as part of the Honors Program.

Applications (attached) are due in the Office of Student Affairs no later than noon, January 15th. Interviews will be scheduled in February, and the successful applicants will be notified by March 1st.
