



**Susan D. Flynn Oncology Nursing Fellowship Program
Supported by Stephen Corman
Stamford Hospital Summer 2018**

Background: Employing ANCC’s transition-to-practice conceptual model (including program leadership, organizational enculturation, development & design, practice-based learning, continuing professional development and quality outcomes), Stamford Hospital has developed a Summer Oncology Nursing Fellowship Program. The program is being sponsored by Frederick C. Flynn, Jr. in the memory of his wife Susan, who died of ovarian cancer in 2013. Financial support provided by Stephen Corman.

Practicum Goal: Provide a comprehensive program to enable a student entering senior year of a baccalaureate nursing program to acquire the knowledge, skills and professional behaviors to deliver safe, quality care that meets defined (organizational or professional society) standards of practice in a comprehensive cancer center setting under the preceptorship of an experienced registered nurse. The Fellowship will encompass organizational orientation, practice-based experience, and supplemental activities to promote continuing professional development in Oncology Nursing.

Application Process:

Eligibility:

This Fellowship is available to rising seniors from either Sacred Heart University School of Nursing or Fairfield University’s School of Nursing. To be eligible for this Fellowship, a candidate must have successfully completed the Fall junior year semester of a BSN program, have a minimum 3.2 cumulative GPA and be in “good standing” status at their school. Stamford Hospital will be accepting 2 fellowship students for the summer of 2018. The Nursing Fellowship Program will begin June 2018 for 8 weeks.

Deadline for applications is February 16th, 2018.

Application:

Applications will include a detailed essay demonstrating applicant’s strong desire to practice in the oncology setting, Planetree ideology and enculturation of Stamford Hospital’s core values (e.g. teamwork, compassion, integrity, respect and accountability). Selection Process: Will include a comprehensive review of submitted application materials and selective interviews. Selection committee will be comprised of Stamford Hospital’s Director of Professional Development, GEMs Professional Development Specialist, Oncology Nurse Manager and Human Resource Partner. Upon successful completion of this Fellowship program, the student nurse will receive priority consideration for employment in Oncology services in Stamford Hospital’s 2019 GEMs program

Program Completion:

In conjunction with this Fellowship, each student nurse will be required to complete and present an evidence-based research project. The principal objective of this project will be to improve the quality of care provided to Oncology/Palliative Care patients at Stamford Hospital, translate this improvement into daily practice, and disseminate this information to the Stamford Hospital health care team members and our academic partners. The Professional Development Department will provide mentorship and resources for the support of this project. Opportunities for presentation of this project may include Nursing Leadership Forum, Nursing Grand Rounds, Shared Governance Council and/or 2018 GEMs Graduation.
