The Fellowship includes a comprehensive scope of direct observational and learning experiences. Students will have exposure to oncology nursing within the context of a pediatric hospital setting. They will learn about the roles and responsibilities of a pediatric oncology nurse and discover possible career opportunities. Additionally, through this experience nursing students will also be able to learn about the following:

- Clinical Research & Clinical Trials
- · Chemotherapeutic agents
- Infusion Services
- Radiation Therapy
- Palliative Care (resources, services, benefits)
- Hospice Services
- Patient & Family Support Programs
- Various Internal Oncology-Related Forums

As part of this learning/development experience the Fellows will complete an evidence-based practice project addressing some aspect of pediatric oncology nursing. This project will be presented to oncology nurses and nursing leadership at a formal Fellowship closing ceremony during the last week of the program.

Program Schedule:

The program will span nine weeks from Monday, June 17 through Friday, August 16, 2019. It will be centered within our pediatric oncology inpatient units at Boston Children's Hospital and the Jimmy Fund Clinic.

Compensation:

Two selected Fellows will be paid a stipend as they complete this Fellowship program.
